I, Joseph Ivey, of the District and State aforesaid,
do make and ordain the following, as my last
will and testament.

First. I desire all my just debts
to be paid.

Secondly. I give to my wife
Charity, for and during the term of her natural
life, or widowhood, the land on which I
live, containing about two hundred acres, and
I devise to her absolutely, the land which I sold
to her son Emanuel Graham, being a part
of the tract aforesaid, containing about ninety
acres, and for which I have made a deed of
conveyance to my wife.

Thirdly. I give to my son Levi
Ivey, the negroes Caroline and Mirra, -
(called Runaway) and his child Effy.

Fourthly. I give to my son
Gadi Ivey, the negroes Katy, Celia and Alice -
and after the death of my wife, I give him
the negroes Millie and Lucy.

Fifthly. I give to my sons
Gadi and Levi, equally, to be divided between
them, share and share alike, the following
property viz - at the death of my wife, all
the increase of Lucy, including the child David,
- and I give to them, at my death, all my other
property, of every description whatsoe'er, not disposed
of, specifically, by this will.

Sixthly. After the death of
my wife, I devise the land given to her, for life, to
my grand-son, Levi, the son of Gadi Ivey,
to him and his heirs, forever.

Seventhly. I have omitted
my daughter Patsy, in the provisions of this

heretofore given her and her husband, is sufficient,
and for other reasons, satisfactory to me as
a parent, which have had their weight with
me in this step, but which I prefer not to
Commit to writing, in this, my last will and
testament.

Eighty. I hereby nominate,
constitute and appoint Gadi Joy
as my executor. -
