Kirk, Gills and Fondren performed a wonderful operation, died on Monday, Having lived under his serious wounds thirteen days. We are told death was caused from the bullet wound that passed through his neck and lodged in his shoulder and not from the stomach wound. Dr. Fondren says the operation was a perfect success and but for the wound in the shoulder he undoubtable recovered.
