- 7e John Doss Ivy, Son of Thomas J. Ivy, b- 25Jun 1871 Winston County, MS d- 23 Mar 1898 Winston County, MS m- 23 Feb 1893 to Eliza Catherine McKay b- 28 Aug 1872 Winston County, MS d- 21 Jun 1962 [she was first cousin to John] daughter of Rush and Nancy Ann (Ivy) McKay. John Sr. is buried in Antioch Cemetery off Hwy. 25 north of Louisville, Winston, MS. Eliza Catherine is buried in the New Hope Cemetery in the Estes Mill Community, Leake County, MS [ see a Bloody Battle at the end of this narrative for circumstances surrounding the death of John Doss Sr.]
- John Doss and Eliza Catherine had two children 1. Lucy Belle 2. John Doss II or Jr. Eliza Catherine remarried in 1899 to Junious Baker Bradford.
- 7.1 Junious Baker Bradford, son of Nathaniel Bradford, b- 30 May 1843 Elbert County, GA d- 1920 they had two children 1. Cora Lee Bradford b- 8 Aug 1900 Wier area of Choctaw County, MS d- 14 Oct 1984 Leake County MS Memorial Hospital, Carthage, MS 2. Jim Drane Bradford ( aka Drane J.) b- 21 Jan 1905 Weir, Choctaw, MS d- 26 Jun 1987 m- Exie Cloma Crocker b- 11 Aug 1927, b- 10 Jan 1908 d- 1987, daughter of, Thomas and Ada Driskell Crocker Exie was born in the Sebastopol community, Scott County, MS. Exie and Drane are buried in Methodist Church Cemetery, Cary, MS More on them later.
- 7.1.1 History of Junious Baker Bradford: he enlisted in the Confederate States Army on 15 Jul 1861 in Co. "C " 15th Regiment of Georgia Volunteers as a Private in Gen. Robert E. Lee's Army of Northern Virginia. The company was nicknamed "Fireside Guards", the commander was Captain Luther H. O. Martin. Junious was appointed 3rd Corporal on 23 Jun 1862. He was wounded in the thigh and hand by cannon shot at Sharpsburg, Maryland on 17 Sep 1862. His brother Nathaniel was killed and buried during this battle. Junious was also wounded during the battle of the Wilderness and at Second Manassas, at the battle of Gettysburg, PA he suffered bowel Trouble and had to be hospitalized. According to muster rolls and payroll records he was never for more than two weeks even when wounded. In April of 1863 he was promoted to 5th Sargeant and on 4 Mar 1864 he was transfered to "F" Company, 15th Regiment of Infantry, as a 5th Sergeant. On 7 May 1864 he was wounded and put in a field hospital where records show him as a Private in F Company. On Benning's Brigade list of casualties, it shows him as being wounded at Richmond, VA He surrendered at Appomattox Courthouse, Virginia in April of 1865 on duty and still a Private.
- Junious returned to Elbert County, Georgia where he farmed and married Mary Molly Norwood b- abt 1839 d- ?, on 7 Jun 1866 in Elbert County, GA.
- Their children were; Daniel "Dan" Andrew Bradford b- 17 Feb 1869; Harriet Norwood Bradford b- 10 Jan 1872; John Bradford b- 9 Oct 1873; and Tacki Bura Bradford b- 5 Jun
