





Elias Ivey was 81 years, 6 months and 18 days old when he passed away on Tuesday, October 11, 1977.

IVEY, ELIAS AND ORA RICHARDS

Elias Ivey was born on a ranch near Hale Center, Texas. His father, W. E. Ivey, established the first general mercantile store in Hale Center.

In 1913 young Ivey went to work for the Santa Fe Railroad as a brakeman. He gained promotions and was conductor on the first train which steamed into Seagraves in 1917.

He liked Seagraves and in 1922 quit the railroad to live there where he established the first drug store, and in 1925 built the first motion picture house.

In 1926 he married Ora Richards of Seagraves and the couple moved to a farm 12 miles east of Denver City. He remained in ranching and agriculture until 1937 when he took the school tax position.

As tax assessor/collector for Sligo Independent School District and, later Denver City Independent School District, he saw it grow from only a dozen students in 1937 with an evaluation of \$240,000 to a school system of 1475 pupils and an evaluation of \$47,570,415.

Ivey retired at 69 after setting what may be a record among Texas school districts for tax collecting. During his nearly 27 years as tax assessor/collector for the Denver City Independent School Districts he collected an average of 99.30 per cent of the tax bills.

Services for Elias Ivey, Sr. 81, were held Friday Oct. 14 at 2:00 p.m. in the Trinity Baptist Church, with Rev. C. J. McQuillen officiating.

Burial was in the Denver City Memorial Park under direction of Singleton Funeral Home.

Ivey died at 12:18 p.m. Tuesday Oct. 11 in the Seminole Memorial Hospital after a lengthy illness.

Mr. Ivey was born March 23, 1896 in Hale Center, he had been a 39 year resident of Yoakum County. He was married to Ora Richards 51 years ago in Seagraves, Texas.

Ivey was the conductor on the first train into Seagraves and he opened the first drug store and first theater in Seagraves. Ivey was also engaged in farming until the time Denver City was first founded.

Ivey became the school tax collector for Sligo Independent School District and was the tax collector for 29 years. Ivey was a member of the Denver City Oddfellows.

Survivors include his wife; three sons, Elias Ivey Jr., and Lee Ivey both of Denver City, and Richard Byron Ivey of Salt Lake City, Utah; one daughter Eva (Sis) Boyd of Denver City; one brother Luke of Hillsboro, Tex.; seven grand-children; and five great-grand-children.
